### **SUNDAY** – Triumphal Entry Into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday)

Jesus riding on a colt (Zechariah 9:9)  
Jesus in city and temple - Mark 11:11  
Jesus retires to Bethany for the night - Mark 11:11

### **MONDAY** – Jesus Returns To Jerusalem

Fig tree cursed – Matthew 21:18-19; Mark 11:12-14  
Second cleansing of the temple – Matthew 21:12-17; Mark 11:15-19; Luke 19:45-48

### **TUESDAY** – Last Day in the Temple, Teaching

Christ's authority challenged – Matthew 21:23-27; Mark 11:27-33; Luke 20:1-8  
Parable of two sons – Matthew 21:28-32  
Parable of wicked husbandman – Matthew 21:33-43; Mark 12:1-9; Luke 19:9-16

### **WEDNESDAY** – No Record of This Day, perhaps a quiet day at Bethany

### **THURSDAY** – The Passover Meal and the Lord's Supper

Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30; John 13:1-30

During the day – preparation for the Passover meal  
Early evening – the Passover meal  
Jesus washed the disciples' feet – John 13:4-16  
Betrayal by Judas foretold – Matthew 26:21-25; Mark 14:18-21; Luke 22:21-23; John 13:18-30  
Peter's denial foretold – Matthew 26:30-35; Mark 14:26-31; Luke 22:31-34; John 13:36-38  
LORD'S SUPPER (COMMUNION) INSTITUTED – Matthew 26:26-29; Mark 14:22-25; Luke 22:19-

THE UPPER ROOM DISCOURSE – John 14-16

John 14 – The promise of Christ’s return  
Christ the Way, Truth, and Life  
Christ and the Father

John 15 – The vine and branches  
Attitude of the world foretold

John 16 – Christ’s departure and the coming of the Holy Spirit  
The “little while” of His absence and joy of His return

CHRIST’S GREAT INTERCESSORY PRAYER – John 17

Christ and His disciples leave upper room and walk to Gethsemane (Late Thurs. night)

THE AGONY OF GETHSEMANE – Matthew 26:36-46; Mark 14:32-42; Luke 22:39-46;  
John 18:1-11

Christ prays three times and submits to God’s will  
Sweat as drops of blood  
The betrayal by Judas and arrest of Jesus  
Peter and the healing of Malchus’ ear

**FRIDAY** – Trials of Jesus, probably between midnight Thursday and early AM Friday  
Matthew 26:57-27:31; Mark 14:53-15:20; Luke 22:54-23:25; John 18:12-19:16

RELIGIOUS TRIALS (JEWISH)

First	Annas	
Second	Caiaphas	Death sentence for blasphemy
Third	Sanhedrin	Death sentence made legal

Jesus declares He is the Son of God – Mark 14:61-62

Peter’s denial – Matthew 26:69-75; Mark 14:66-72; Luke 22:54-60; John 18:15-27

CIVIL TRIALS (ROMAN)

<u>Trial</u>	<u>Judge</u>	<u>Decision</u>
Fourth	Pilate	Not guilty
Fifth	Herod	Not guilty
Sixth	Pilate	Not guilty

Jesus turned over to the Jews and Barabas released

Judas’ suicide – Matthew 27:3-10

THE CRUCIFIXION – Matthew 27:32-56; Mark 15:21-41; Luke 23:26-49; John 19:16-37

On the cross

9 – 12 AM - “Father forgive them”  
“Today you will be with Me in paradise”  
“Woman, behold your Son”  
12 – 3 PM - “My God, why has Thou forsaken Me”  
(Darkness) “I thirst”  
“It is finished”  
“Into Thy hands I commend My Spirit”

Earthquake  
Veil of temple rent from top to bottom  
Burial of Jesus in tomb of Joseph of Arimathea

**SATURDAY** – Body in the Tomb (The Jewish Sabbath)

**SUNDAY** – The Resurrection (Easter)

Matthew 28:1-10; Mark 16:1-11, Luke 23:56-24:12; John 20:1-18

The tomb is empty!

First appearance (early morning) to Mary Magdalene – Mark 16:9-11; John 20:11-18

Second appearance (early morning) to Mary Magdalene and other women – Matthew 28:9-10

Third appearance (afternoon) on road to Emmaus – Luke 24:13-33

Fourth appearance (evening) to Peter and the Apostles – Mark 16:13-14; Luke 24:33-43  
John 20:19-25

Matthew 12:40 – “three days and three nights” allows for crucifixion on Friday and resurrection on Sunday when one understands that the Jews reckon any part of a day as an entire 24 hour period.

## **LATER APPEARANCES**

Sunday, one week later

Appearance to Thomas – John 20:26-31

Sometime later in Galilee

Appearance by the Sea of Galilee – John 21:1-25

The Great Commission – Matthew 28:16-20

Forty days after the resurrection

The Ascension – Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:9-12
